Naaman's Presumptions:

- He presumes he knew exactly how God would and should act
- He presumed that his motive was God's motive
- He presumed that God's primary purpose was to improve his quality of life—when God's real purpose was his spiritual transformation

Lessons we can learn from Naaman's experience:

- Suffering brings out the worst in us--but the BEST in God.
- God often works through suffering and hard times to achieve His purposes.
- God often works through a network of people to achieve His purpose.
- Human suffering helps us understand WHAT is important and WHO is important.
