'In Defense of a Doubter' Discovering the Real Jesus Luke 7:18-35 ESV

**1)** Doubting often develops from confusion over **<u>mis-understandings</u>** and unfulfilled **<u>expectations</u>** in difficult, unfair and even unexplainable circumstances. **vs18-23** 

<sup>18</sup>The disciples of John reported all **these things** to Him. And John, <sup>19</sup>calling two of his disciples to him, sent them to the Lord, saying: Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another? <sup>20</sup>And when the men had come to him, they said: John the Baptist has sent us to you, saying, 'Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?' <sup>21</sup>In that hour he healed many people of diseases and plagues and evil spirits, and on many who were blind he bestowed sight. <sup>22</sup>And he answered them: Go and tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, the poor have good news preached to them. <sup>23</sup>And blessed is the one who is not offended by me. **vs 18-23** 

**2)** Let Jesus 'Words' and His followers **<u>advocate</u>** for you, not you yourself. **vs24-28** 

<sup>24</sup>When John's messengers had gone, Jesus began to speak to the crowds concerning John: What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? <sup>25</sup> What then did you go out to see? A man dressed in soft clothing? Behold, those who are dressed in splendid clothing and live in luxury are in kings' courts. <sup>26</sup>What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. <sup>27</sup>This is he of whom it is written,

> 'Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way before you.'

<sup>28</sup>I tell you, among those born of women none is greater than John. Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he.
vs. 24-28

**3)** Those rejecting the purpose of God by not admitting their sin and surrendering to Jesus will often **justify** themselves and find something to **judge** Jesus on. **v29-35** 

<sup>29</sup>(When all the people heard this, and the tax collectors too, they declared God just, having been baptized with the baptism of John, <sup>30</sup>but the Pharisees and the lawyers rejected the purpose of God for themselves, not having been baptized by him.) <sup>31</sup>To what then shall I compare the people of this generation, and what are they like? <sup>32</sup>They are like children sitting in the marketplace and calling to one another: We played the flute for you, and you did dance; we sang a dirge, and you did not weep. <sup>33</sup>For John the Baptist has come eating no bread and drinking no wine, and you say: He has a demon. <sup>34</sup>The Son of Man has come eating and drinking, and you say: Look at him! A glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners! <sup>35</sup>Yet wisdom is justified by all her children.".
